The meeting was held in the City Council Chambers, located at City Hall, 305 East Main Street, Gaylord, Michigan.

Members Present: Sharrard, Wilson, Awrey, Ouellette, Hartz, and Ryan.

Motion by Hartz, supported by Ryan to dispense with the reading of the minutes from the May 22, 2023 meeting and accept them as presented.

Ayes: Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Motion by Wilson, supported by Ryan to excuse Councilmember Witt from tonight's meeting.

Ayes: Unanimous. Motion Carried.

A public hearing regarding a Special Assessment for Police and Fire Services for 2023-2024 opened at 7:01PM.

A public hearing regarding the City of Gaylord's 2023-2024 Annual Budget and Millage Levy opened at 7:01PM.

No comments were received by the public. The hearings closed at 7:30PM.

Public Comment:

Catherine Richter requested the approval of plans for their church to hold a BBQ on Father's Day.

A motion was made by Wilson, supported by Hartz to approve the event for one day only, contingent upon completing and submitting a Temporary Outdoor Café Permit to the zoning administrator for approval.

Ayes: unanimous. Motion Carried.

C. Krajniak spoke regarding tornado alley; the huge hole at the corner of Jenson and Court, the "moat" and the dead trees behind Dollar General.

New Business:

Motion by Hartz, supported by Ouellette to approve the Special Assessment for Police and Fire Services for 2023-2024.

The Gaylord City Council having held a public hearing on June 12th, 2023, on the question of the annual amount of the special assessment for police and fire protection, the estimated costs and expenses of police and fire protection, and the special assessment roll, and having duly considered the matter including the amount of the annual special assessment for the fiscal year 2023-2024, and having heard any objections that were offered and having considered the matter further, **NOW THEREFORE**,

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the amount of the special assessment for fiscal year 2023-2024 shall be 4.000 mils of the taxable value of each parcel subject to the special assessment, and the special assessment roll as presented at said public hearing is hereby approved.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that 11.2590 mills be levied on the taxable valuation for the purpose of paying the General Fund operating expenses for the 2023/24 fiscal year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that 0.6000 mills be levied on the taxable valuation for the purpose of providing funds for composting and curbside recycling within the City of Gaylord; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that 4.1513 mills be levied on the taxable valuation for the purpose of providing funds for improvements to the streets and related infrastructure within the City of Gaylord; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that 1.4000 mills be levied on the taxable valuation for the purpose of meeting 2006 General Obligation Debt Fund requirements (City Hall/DPW Capital Improvement Construction Project) for the fiscal year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that 1.8051 mills be levied on the taxable valuation in the Downtown Development District for the purpose of paying Downtown Development Administration expenses for the fiscal year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the amount of the special assessment heretofore imposed upon all properties within the special assessment district pursuant to MCL 41.801 for the fiscal year 2023-2024 shall be in the amount of 4.000 mills of the taxable value of each parcel within the special assessment district as heretofore created.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Treasurer is hereby authorized to collect 11.2590 mills for general operation purposes; .6000 mills for composting and curbside recycling purposes; 4.1513 mills for street and infrastructure improvements; 1.4000 mills for debt retirement purposes, 1.8051 mills be collected on the taxable valuation in the Downtown Development District for administration purposes, and a Special Assessment equal to 4.000 mills of taxable value of each parcel subject to the Special Assessment be levied for the purpose of defraying some or all of the cost of police or fire motor vehicles, apparatus, equipment and housing and the maintenance and operation of the City Police and Fire departments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager and City Clerk are hereby authorized to make budgetary transfers within the appropriations established in this budget, and that all transfers between appropriations may be made only by further action of the Gaylord City Council, pursuant to the provisions of the Michigan Uniform Accounting and Budgeting Act.

WHEREAS, the City of Gaylord supports the submission of an application titled, "Aspen Park Elk Park Expansion" to the Spark grant program for the City of Gaylord's Aspen Park Elk Park Expansion project at Aspen Park; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gaylord is hereby making a financial commitment to the project in the amount of \$200,000 matching funds, in cash and/or force account; and

WHEREAS, if the grant is awarded the applicant commits its local match and donated amounts from the following sources:

Gaylord Are Convention and Tourism Bureau: \$25,000.00

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Gaylord hereby authorizes submission of a Spark grant application for \$689,000.00 and further resolves to make available a local match through financial commitment and donation(s) of \$225,000.00, (24%) of a total \$914,000.00 project cost during the 2023-2024 fiscal years.
