Motion by Wilson, supported by Witt to approve the Street Millage Ballot Proposal Language for a renewal of the levy of an ad valorem tax of 4.1513 mills for 10 years. This is a renewal and will be asked of our residents/voters in November.

Motion by Witt, supported by Awrey to approve the First Amendment to Lease Agreement with Gaylord Soccer League.
